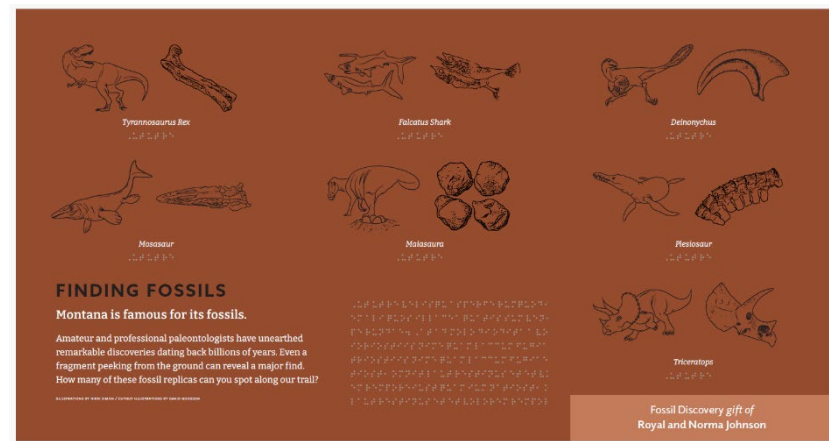
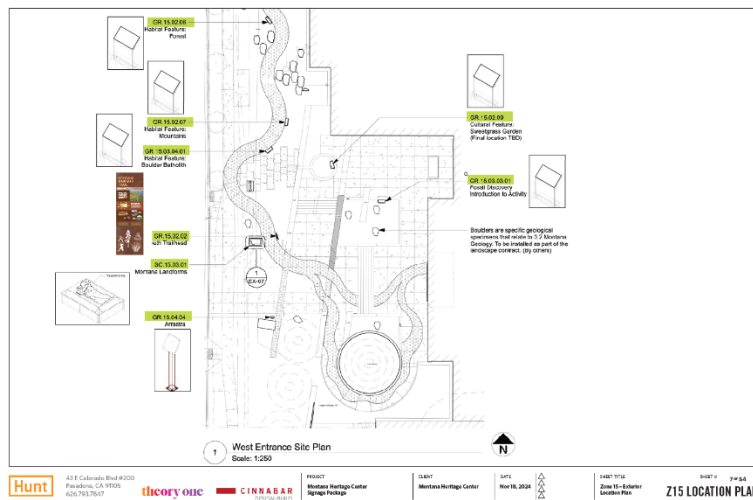

4. Betty Babcock commemoration	Granite Stone near entrance	Betty Babcock



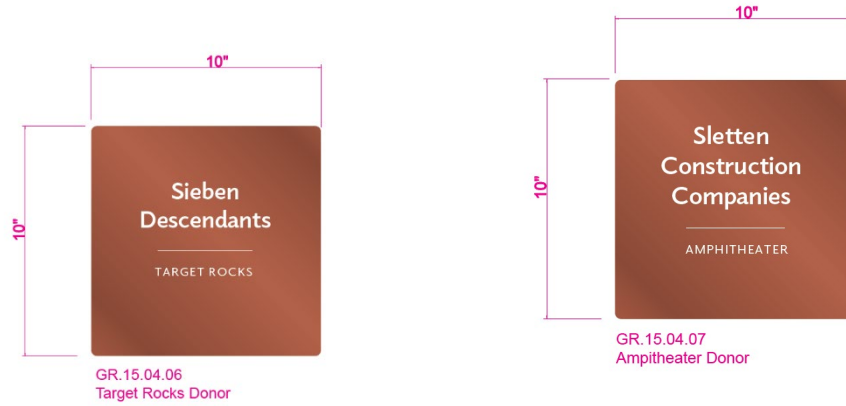
1. Betty Babcock Exterior Recognition is on a granite pillar near the west entrance to the Montana Heritage center



2. Fossil Discovery plaque will be placed near the west entrance to the Montana Heritage Center

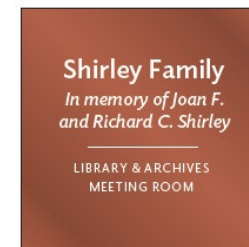
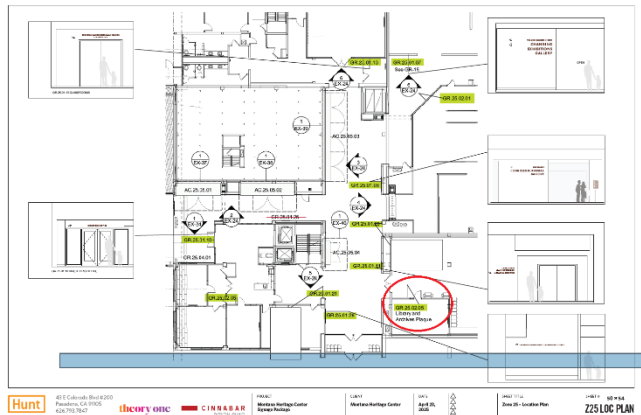


3. Target Rocks plaque is located near the Montana Landforms Map
